## KNOW YOUR FOOTPRINT

## PURCHASE ETHICALLY

Consider the people who make the goods that you buy and where they are made. Research companies, suppliers and vendors to learn about how they treat their employees.



## BE MINDFUL WHEN TIPPING



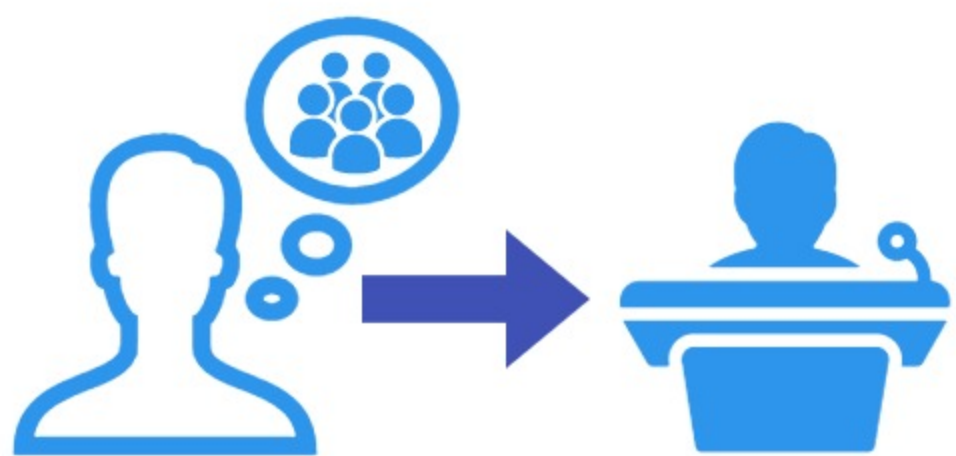
An extra dollar could mean much more to the person across the counter than it means to you. Take notice of who accepts tips and if they get to keep the tip.

## BE A MEDIA ACTIVIST

If you encounter media that doesn't tell the full story or that portrays survivors in an unfair light, jump into the comment section or write a letter to the editor. Hold media accountable!



## BE CONSCIENTIOUS



Shame and stigma discourage people who are being exploited from seeking help. The language that we use matters.

## THINK LONG TERM

Do not confront a trafficker or approach a victim on your own. This may harm more than help. Contact My Sisters' Place for more information. In an emergency, always call 911.
